Edith and Arnold Bodtker Grant for Research/Internships

The Danish American Heritage Society calls for applications for the Edith and Arnold Bodtker Grant for research or internships. The research or internship must be done at the Danish American Archive and Library at Dana College; the Danish Immigrant Archive at Grand View University, or The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn, Iowa. North American students doing research/internship in Denmark may also apply. The grant of up to \$3,000 is for applicants from Denmark, Canada, or the United States.

Requirements:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled at or graduated from a university-level institution.
- Applicants must also have a well-defined research/internship project that makes a stay in the United States (for Danish or North American students) or Denmark (only for North American students) essential.
- Research/Internship projects should be planned for a 3-4 month period in the US or Denmark during the next calendar year.
- Approved applicants must be prepared to submit an article suitable for publication in *The Bridge*, the Danish American Heritage Society's bi-annual historical journal.

Deadline:

- **October 1** each year. Applications and all supporting materials must reach Egon Bodtker, President, Danish American Heritage Society, 925 15th Street, NE Salem, Oregon 97301, USA, by this date. Approved applicants will be announced by October 20th each year.

About the Danish American Heritage Society:

The Danish American Heritage Society (DAHS) is a historical society, founded in 1977 to explore and record the history of Danish immigrants to North America. The DAHS publishes a bi-annual historical journal, *The Bridge*, containing scholarly and popular articles, essays, translations, stories, and book reviews. The DAHS also engages in various social and cultural activities, such as sponsoring conferences and cooperating with other organizations on joint projects.

The Danish American Heritage Society's three sister organizations also have, as their primary function, the preservation of the history and culture of the Danish-American experience.
