



Traveling Exhibition Fact Sheet

Title: *Jens Jensen:
Celebrating the Native Prairie*

Topic: Jens Jensen is celebrated as a pioneer of the “prairie school” of landscape architecture. He was an early advocate of using native plants in parks and garden design, and conserving natural spaces for human recreation and reflection.

Dates available: July 2012 through 2014

Space required: 15 linear feet

Exhibit fee: \$200 for up to one month, plus the cost of insured shipping. Organizational members of The Danish Immigrant Museum pay a reduced exhibit fee of \$100 for up to one month, plus the cost of insured shipping. Longer rentals may be negotiated.

Contents: Five free-standing retractable banners, each approximately 36 inches wide by 80 inches tall. One DVD with a rolling slideshow of Jensen landscapes. (Borrower is responsible for providing the equipment to play the DVD for their audience.)

Organizing Institution: This panel exhibition and its national tour is solely organized by The Danish Immigrant Museum. Funding was provided in part by Humanities Iowa and the National Endowment for the Humanities. Additional funding provided by the Albert Victor Ravenholt Fund.
