What's Up at the Museum?

Houston/Danevang Board Meeting

The museum's board of directors held its winter meeting, February 7 - 9, in Houston, Texas. On Thursday, board members and staff were invited to tour the Holocaust Museum Houston and enjoy a traditional Danish dinner prepared by Soren Pedersen, chef and co-owner of Sorrel Urban Bistro. Friday, the group

traveled to the Danish Heritage Museum of Danevang where committee meetings were held and members of the Danish Heritage Preservation Society served an authentic Texas BBQ lunch. Meetings resumed and Angela Stanford, our Curator of Collections/Registrar, held a workshop entitled "How to Catalog and Care for Artifact Collections" for members of the DHPS board. The musem's 92nd board meeting was held on Saturday morning with a bit of free time following. We were honored to host nearly 50 guests at the evening banquet with representation from Houston

The program for the banquet was "Saving the Hanne Frank" presented by Walter Hansen, a conservator working with the Holocaust Museum Houston to restore the 1940s-era Danish fishing boat, now in their permanent collection, that represents the boats that carried Danish Jews to safety in Sweden in 1943. Genealogy Website Update

On February 19th genealogists using the website www.arkivalieronline.dk to search for and view digital census and church book images will see a new homepage. The basic homepage, which now looks like other pages in



the Danish State Archives system, has a brief English-language introduction (top of page), but otherwise navigation is in Danish. Access to church, census and other records is through the drop-down menu right next to the large 'A' in the red box. Danish Artists in Exhibitions in Washington, D.C. and Milwaukee, WI

A World Apart: Anna Ancher and the Skagen Art Colony is the largest exhibition of Anna Ancher's work ever to be held in the United States. A well-known and much-loved figure in Denmark, Anna Ancher is most admired for her paintings of interiors filled with light and color, influenced by Impressionism. Ancher was a talented and versatile artist who created some of the most avant-garde works to come out of the art colony in the remote, northern town of Skagen, Denmark. Including over 40 paintings by Ancher and more than 20 by her Skagen colleagues, this exhibition explores Ancher's role as the only professional female artist within the colony and, in turn, her place in the history of western art.

View the exhibit at the National Museum of Women in the Arts in Washington, D.C., February 15–May 12.

Modern Rookwood: 1918-1933 showcases select works from the Rookwood Pottery Company, which opened in Cincinnati in 1880 and survived through the Great Depression. The company, marketed as "an artist's studio, not a factory," was arguably the most celebrated ceramic producer in the country because of their experimental designs and exceptionally fine glazes. A fascinating chapter of Rookwood's history will be presented in this exhibition of 37 porcelain vessels painted by the company's best-known decorators including Jens Jensen, a Danish immigrant artist.
